Writing Assignment (25 homework points)

Read the Mao file found in course reserves (<https://eres.lib.washington.edu/eres/coursepage.aspx?cid=6069&page=docs>), and write a paper (approximately 2 pages in length, double-spaced, 1-inch margins all around, 11-12 point type) that answers the following questions. (Note: "CCP" = Chinese Communist Party.)

1. Why did tens of thousands of relatively well-educated young people flock to join Mao in Yenan, and how did they feel upon arrival? (Note: Upon arrival they were, for all practical purposes, prisoners of Mao, having turned their lives over to him.)
2. Explain how this scenario relates to our course textbook, Hurley p. 550, "second element."
3. Explain how and why their initial feelings changed.
4. Explain Mao's responding "human engineering project" carried out on these young people.
5. Explain the effect of this project on the young people, i.e. how did the young people change as a result of their experience?
