
Modifying your UW Computing Environment: Setting Up Accounts¹

Go to the following URL. https://uwnetid.washington.edu/manage/?service

A screen asking you to login will appear. Use your UW NetID (the one you use for e-mail), and your password to log in.



Login gives you 8-hour access without repeat login to UW NetID-protected Web resources.

Homer and Dante are used for Email. Mead and Goodall accounts are used for UNIX Computing.

Always to remember to shut down all sessions Windows Explorer after logging into MyUW before you leaving a public machine. If someone else gains access to your "MyUW", they can change your password, gain access to personal information, and more.
