# William Thomas Dorcy and Sylva Agatha Miller

William was born in Harrison County, Mississippi in 1899 at a time when his father, John Carroll Dorcy, and his mother, Bridget Corr, were struggling hard to make a life for their family on a 160 acre homestead. Bill was the fourth of their five children. They grew sugar cane and potatoes and raised pigs and by the time William was born they were already thinking about pulling up stakes and moving on to something more promising. According to letters which have survived, times were not too good for farming and Bill's father, John, was away from home a good deal, as he had been when the family lived in Michigan. He was probably working in the logging industry to make extra money for the family. It was 1906 when the family moved to the Northwest, and the majority of Bill's youth was spent in the Skagit County, WA area.

Bill's mother died when he was 13 and he spent some of his youth working as "Bull Cook" or assistant cook in the logging camp where his father worked. Probably as a result of that experience, he became an excellent cook over the years. He developed many recipes, though he seldom wrote any of them down. Later, when he became a widower, his cakes were the envy of the ladies at the grange where he went to dances.

He went to school in Sedro Wooley and a neighbor of the family, named Morgan, thought Bill had great potential. They encouraged him and helped financially to send him to the Catholic high school at St. Martin's, in Lacey, WA. We find several mentions of William in the school records. He was awarded the Davis Cup in 1915 for contributing the best story to The Martian, the school newspaper quarterly. He also was named as "distinguished" for academic achievement in 1915. He was in two plays in his graduation year, 1916, and was a business manager of The Martian. Family


stories say that he was at least considering going on to Gonzaga College, but we have been unable to determine that he did so. Bill had unusually beautiful handwriting, perhaps learned at St. Martin's, and when he was a senior he was awarded a Certificate for Proficiency in Penmanship.

He was small in stature with very dark hair and eyes, and he was proud of his Irish heritage. He maintained correspondence with cousins on his mother's side who lived in County Down, Ireland; and because of that, later generations have been able to exchange letters and visits with their Irish cousins.

In 1917 and in 1918 he is listed in the Polk directory for the city of Seattle. In 1917 he was at 1207 Seneca and in 1918 he was a salesman for Armour and Company living at 908 Jefferson.

In 1918 Bill met Sylva Agatha Miller. They said they were married 11 Oct 1918, but the only record we have found is when Father Carmody married them at Sacred Heart Church in South Bellingham on 7 April 1923. They may have had a civil wedding in Seattle before that, but no record has been found. Their first address was 1900 34th St., Bellingham. In August of 1921 they bought land at 37th and Lindsay for \$30 and built a small unfinished frame house there. Bill called it a shanty! It had an old wood heater and

an elk horn rack where Bill kept his gun. Hot water came from a copper boiler sitting on the stove and the necessity house was outside and as cold as could be. Sylva was a talented pianist and Bill moved her piano from Seattle to the shanty. This remained their address as the family grew until it caught fire in early 1931. For about five years Bill is listed in Polk's city directory as a "tally man"; but where or for whom, we don't know. It was probably for one of the many mills operating at that time. By 1929

he is listed as manager of Commercial Collection Company and remained there several years until in 1935 he is listed in Polk's directory as a road engineer. We know that he helped engineer and build some of the roads in the Fairhaven area of Bellingham and that he worked on the Mount Baker highway.



When Bill and Sylva's home at 3803 Lindsay burned down, they moved to 1614 McKenzie St. in Fairhaven, a district of south Bellingham. They remained at this address as their family continued to grow until 1938, when they bought the beautiful old Victorian house on Gambier Street. This was home to the family for many years to come, with its beautiful view of Bellingham Bay, and space for a garden and a small orchard.

During the depression of the 1930s Bill was employed as Secretary for The International Hod Carrier, Building and Common Laborer's Union. The union job brought the first telephone into the home and the children remember that they were among the first families in the neighborhood to have a phone. They all agree that permission for its use by the children was hard to come by!

When World War II started, Bill worked in the shipyards in South Bellingham as a sheet metal worker. After the war ended, he became a private contractor. He continued as a private contractor, mostly cement work, for many years until he retired. Bill did a lot of bartering, trading his skills for necessities, usually giving more than the required amount of work. He bartered for such things as doctor bills and the annual use of a horse and driver to till the huge garden he needed to feed his large family. He was a hard

worker, a "jack of all trades", and he was always helping friends and neighbors with their projects. Bill was devoted to the Roman Catholic church and as a staunch Catholic he helped keep his church in repair.

He was a "Union Man" and very proud of it. On Labor Day he would buy a new cap, put his union button in the center above the bill and proudly march in the Labor Day parade.

The garden was very much a family affair, remembered with varying degrees of fondness by each of his children. It was an event when the horses came in the spring to plow the garden next to the house. The produce was a major part of the family diet and what wasn't consumed fresh was put up in hundreds of jars for the winter. This included the fruit from the plum, apple, pear, cherry, and crab-apple trees in the back yard.

Bill's wife, Sylva, died in February of 1950 and he finished raising the four children still living at home. Judy was only 9 years old, Bonnie was 14, Bill was 15, and Aileen was 17. It was a difficult job for a man who thought that child care and housework were only for women, but he did it.

After the last child was married and settled, he sold the old Victorian house in Bellingham and moved to Everett to be closer to some of his family.

Bill died December 2nd, 1972, in Everett, WA.

## Sylva Agatha Miller

Sylva, born in 1899 in Bad Axe, Michigan, was the last of the five children born to John Franklin Miller (usually called Frank) and Laura Maila Doty. The Miller family had come from Scotland to Canada in the early part of the nineteenth century and John's family moved to Michigan in 1871. Laura Maila family was descended from Mayflower pilgrim, Edward Doty. Her family also came to Michigan, where Frank and Laura were neighbors. They married in 1880. Prior to Sylva's birth they had three boys and also a girl, who died at age five months. When Sylva was born in 1899, Laura Maila remained in poor health and died in June when Sylva was about six months old.

In 1900 her father, Frank, left Sylva with his mother-in-law (Laura's step-mother, Maria Hyde Doty) and went to Washington to look for work, taking his three boys with him. About a year later his widowed mother-in-law, Mariah (Hyde) Doty, joined him, bringing along her two daughters, Sarah Cecil and Mary, and baby Sylva.

Sylva had an unsettled childhood, living part of the time with her Grandmother and part of the time with her father and his third wife, Agnes, and some of the time with her two aunts, Cecil and Mary.

We don't know how or when Sylva met William T. Dorcy, but they were married in October of 1918. Her friend, Ethel Kelly, told us that Sylva always kept her home attractive and welcoming, even the old shanty. Their children were:

- (4) Laura Theresa Dorcy was born in 1919 in Bellingham, WA. She was named for both of her grandmothers but soon after birth was nicknamed Daisy and that is what most of us called her. She attended schools in Bellingham and graduated from Fairhaven High School in 1936. While there she earned a Fairhaven letter with four stripes in sports and a Cum Laude scroll with a gold scholarship pin. items were very precious to Daisy and just before she died in 1994 she gave them to the Friends of Fairhaven High. This group, which is dedicated to the preservation of the memory of the old Fairhaven High School, in turn placed Daisy's items in a time capsule at the dedication of the new Fairhaven Middle School in 1995. All the family can feel proud to be remembered in this way at the school near where so many of the family grew up. Daisy graduated from Bellingham Normal School with a teaching degree in 1943. She taught elementary school in Bellingham, Hobart, and later in Everett. She married David Freel King, son of Charles Philip and Grace (Bean) King, in 1942 in Everett, David was born in New Hampshire in 1912 and was an electrician for most of his career. They lived in Seattle, Oak Harbor, Lynnwood and retired to Tyee Beach on Camano Island. About this time Laura became very active in the Catholic church in Stanwood, WA. She and Dave traveled quite a bit in their travel trailer and later bought some land on the Nooksack River. Laura really loved the peace and quiet of their retreat on the river. In those later years David worked with his bulldozer and truck and operated a small sawmill. Their children are:
  - (5) Marilyn Bridget King was born in 1944 in Seattle, WA. She attended Washington State University from 1962-66. She married George Patrick McGinnis, a veterinarian, in 1966. They were divorced in 1979 and Marilyn lives in Hood River, OR where she is Transcription Supervisor at Hood River Memorial Hospital. She enjoys pets, yard work and flowers, and driving and walking in the woods. They had:
    - (6) Sean Patrick McGinnis was born in 1967 in Seattle, WA. He graduated from Washington State University in Construction Management. In 1994 he married Kristina Noelle Whitmore, born in 1969 in Gresham, OR. Sean is currently employed by Kiewit Pacific in Renton, WA.

- (6) Shani Patrice McGinnis was born in 1970 in Mission Hills, CA. She graduated from the University of Nevada in Reno in 1992. She is currently earning her Doctor of Podiatry in San Francisco. In 1994 she married Joseph Wayne Loader (called Wayne), born in 1968 in Salt Lake City, UT.
- (5) Lawrence Freel King was born in 1945 in Seattle, WA. For the past fifteen years Larry has owned and operated a machine shop near Everett, WA which fabricates aircraft parts for Boeing Aircraft Company. Larry calls it a small business, but he presently has fifteen employees and an array of computerized and manual machines. He has a second business sharing the same premises specializing in rebuilding and restoring Harley Davidsons motorcycles. Larry has built several three wheeled road bikes for fun and business. He enjoys riding motorcycles and often attends the rally in Sturgis, South Dakota. He married first Jeannette Louise Colby in 1965. Their child is:
  - (6) Anthony Michael King was born in 1968 in Lynnwood, WA. Tony is currently working for his dad in the machine shop. His dad says he is a good machinist and a meticulous worker. He enjoys playing the drums.

Larry and Jeanette were divorced. In 1973 he married Annabel Gest and adopted her child, Jacqueline Marie (Gest) King in 1977 in Everett. Jackie was born in 1970 in Texas and is currently a hairdresser. Jackie's child is Skyler R. King who was born in 1989 in Everett, WA. Jackie married Mike Dunbar in 1994. Larry and Annabel's children are:

- (6) Michele Ann King was born in 1974 in Everett, WA. In 1996 she finished a course in photography at Edmonds Community College, and her dad says she is very good with a camera. She is living and working as a waitress in Everett in 1996.
- (6) Darin William King was born in 1977 in Seattle, WA. He graduated from Granite Falls High School in 1996. He is a very hard worker holding a full time job with his dad at the machine shop during the week and making and installing truck canopies for his mother's family business on week ends.
- (5) Bradford Martin King was born in 1951 in Seattle, WA. Brad has worked as an electrician and married first Tammy Lorraine Nedwick in 1980 in Everett, WA and they were divorced in 1986 in Everett. They had:
  - (6) Justin Gregory King was born in 1981 in Seattle.

(6) Amanda Ellen King was born in 1982 at Totem Lake, King County, WA.

Brad married second Dyanne (Horne) Van Valkenburg in 1989. They are living in northwest Montana in 1996 where Brad is establishing a business as a residential electrical contractor and they are building a home.

- (4) Bernard Thomas Dorcy was born in 1926 in Bellingham and went to school there. During one summer while in high school, he worked on a cannery tender out of Ketchican, Alaska for Pacific American Fisheries (PAF). He also worked at Fairhaven Drug Store after school and on weekends from junior high until he graduated from college. He joined the Navy in March 1944 with delayed orders which allowed him to finish high school. He graduated from high school in June, 1944, and served in the navy at Farragut, Idaho, Klamath Naval Air Station, and at the Bremerton Naval Ammunition Depot, where he was a boatswain's mate, 2nd class. His experience as a sea scout in his high school years helped him advance in Navy ranks. He was medically discharged in May, 1946, due to a heart condition brought on by scarlet fever he contacted while on boot leave. He worked for PAF again in Alaska in 1946, worked also for Bellco in Bellingham until the company's facility burned down in January, 1947. He then entered Western Washington College, earning his degree in education in 1950. He married Charlene Marie Colby, daughter of Merritt Colby and Mary (Winchell) Colby in Bellingham in 1946. Charlene was born in 1928 in Bellingham. After graduation Bernie taught in several schools in Mason County. He coached freshman football and high school varsity baseball while teaching special education. He earned his Masters Degree in Education in 1961 and in 1972 he organized the Mason County Extension of Olympic College of Bremerton. Bernie has enjoyed building and remodeling as an avocation and has always been active as a part time builder. He retired in 1981 and they began spending winters in Indio, CA where he spent five years as park manager at Happy Wanderer Trailer park. He retired again in 1995. Their children are:
  - (5) Marcia Marie Dorcy was born in 1947 in Bellingham and graduated from Shelton High School and from Central Washington College with a masters degree. She is presently working as a teacher/administrator at the New Market Vocational Skills Center in Tumwater, WA. She spends all of her spare time attending her boys sporting events. She married Alfred Thomas Lynch, Jr. of Boston, Mass, and their children are:
    - (6) Sean Bartholomew Lynch was born in 1982 in Olympia, WA.

- (6) Timothy Donald Lynch was born in 1984 in Olympia, WA.
- (5) Lane John Colby Dorcy was born in 1950 in Bellingham He graduated from St. Martin's College in 1972 with a B.A. in Physics and minor degrees in Secondary Education and Mathematics. He earned a Masters degree in Computers in Education in 1972. In the fall of 1972 he started teaching eighth grade science at Nisqually Middle School in Lacey, WA. North Thurston School District and still teaches there, now teaching math. He married Karen Monigle in 1972 and they adopted Hilleri Danielle Dorcy at her birth in 1977 at Madigan Hospital, Ft. Lewis, WA. Karen died in 1980 and in 1989 Lane married Barbara (Peters) Gill who is a professional counselor in the Tumwater School District. Barbara is the daughter of Leo and Helen Peters of Grand Rapids, Michigan. She earned a Masters in Special Education from Peabody College in Nashville, Tennessee In 1990 Barbara adopted Hilleri. Lane and Barbara enjoy boating fishing hiking, cross country skiing, reading and Mariners games. Hilleri enjoys hiking, skiing and being with her friends.
- (5) Kevin Patrick Dorcy was born in 1953 in Bellingham. He graduated from Shelton High School and attended Yakima Junior College. He is a general building contractor in Shelton, WA and he married Kathleen Ann Kelley in 1972 in Shelton. She is the office manager for Shelton Family Medicine. Their children are:
  - (6) Michael Kevin Dorcy was born in 1975 in Olympia, WA. Mike is attending Westmont College in Santa Barbara, CA and works at Simpson Lumber Mill as well as Peninsula Savings Bank when he is not in school. In the fall of 1996 he will take an internship in some law offices for six months. Perhaps he will be a lawyer. He will graduate in May 1997.
  - (6) Matthew Thomas Dorcy was born in 1977 in Olympia, WA. He is studying drafting at South Sound Community College in Olympia, WA and also works at Simpson's Lumber Mill.
  - (6) Aaron Avery Dorcy was born in 1983 in Shelton, WA.
- (5) Barbara Gaye Dorcy was born in 1957 in Shelton, WA. She and her husband both graduated from Shelton High School in 1975 and Barb attended St. Martin's College. She has worked part time in the office of Shelton Family Medicine for sixteen years. David L. Herrick, whom she married in 1977, in Shelton is the son of Don and Mary Herrick. He drives a logging

- truck. The whole family enjoys boating, swimming and vacationing in the California desert in the winter. Their children are:
  - (6) Adam David Herrick was born in 1980 in Shelton, WA. Adam enjoys mountain bike racing
  - (6) Andrew Benjamin Herrick was born in 1981 in Shelton, WA. He plays soccer.
  - (6) Ann Marie Herrick was born in 1984 in Shelton, WA and plays soccer too.
- (5) Bruce Thomas Dorcy was born in 1960 in Shelton, WA. He was always on various sport teams and played varsity tennis in high school. He graduated from Shelton High School and then from St. Martin's College in 1982 with a degree in mathematics and business. He worked for super markets all through his school years and he is presently director of the Port Angeles Stock Market. He met Susan Elaine Dekreon, at college and married her in 1981 in Shelton. Susan was born in 1960 in Bellingham. She works in elementary education and is presently a class room helper. She runs a day care center in their home, coaches basket-ball and soccer, and is a brownie troop leader. Bruce and Susan moved their family to Port Angeles in 1988. Their children are, "all doing very well in school and are all very active in sports and other activities". They are:
  - (6) Christopher Ross Dorcy was born in 1982 in Olympia, WA.
  - (6) Nicholas John Dorcy was born in 1985 in Renton, WA.
  - (6) Rachel Susan Dorcy was born in 1987 in Renton, WA.

- (4) Maureen Alice Dorcy, always known as Mickey, was born in 1928 in Bellingham, the 3rd of eight children. She graduated from Bellingham High School and after a year of hard work and saving money attended Washington State College. While there she met and married Wayne Hannah, son of Robert and Ethel (Johnson) Hannah of Tumwater, WA. Mickey worked as a key punch operator for the state offices and at the college while Wayne earned his degree. She continued to work as a keypuncher until their fourth child was born. When Wayne graduated, they moved to Seattle to begin his career with IBM. They lived in Seattle, Olympia, and Tacoma, WA and then in San Jose, CA. The family enjoyed playing together, camping and boating, and even took two camping trips across the country when Wayne was sent to New York for IBM. The family also enjoyed having perhaps a dozen, short term foreign exchange students over the years in San Jose. They were

from Switzerland, Japan, Holland, Brazil, and Italy. Mickey really enjoys working with flowers and playing tennis. Together with Wayne she has gathered many generations of genealogy. The genealogy hobby has sent them all over the country and to Ireland and Scotland looking for ancestors. Mickey was always and still is active in community work and especially in religious education where she earned her Master Catechist credentials at Holy Family Catholic Church in San Jose. She says she is a professional volunteer. Eight children were born to them:
