**Goal of the Clerkship:** Provide an overview of common issues of health and illness relevant to the care of children.

#### **Learning Objectives:**

During the course of the pediatric clerkship, students will:

**1. Identify key features of the diagnosis and management of essential pediatric disease conditions or processes through required readings and patient encounters.**

**Curriculum:** Students will participate in a series of encounters with patients who have essential pediatric diseases, conditions or processes by caring for patients during their inpatient and outpatient activities. The specific conditions are found on the patient encounter checklist to be completed by each student. The list of conditions is derived from the national pediatric curriculum developed by the Council on Medical Student Education in Pediatrics (COMSEP; COMSEP Curriculum 2005). The lists include both acute and chronic illness conditions and issues related to health care maintenance as seen in both the inpatient and outpatient setting.

**Benchmark:** Students are required to document patient encounters for the conditions listed. This list represents the minimum types of encounters to ensure a broad patient-based knowledge of pediatrics. This objective will be ensured, regardless of site or season, by the required completion of 22 broad-based CLIPP (Computerized Learning in Pediatrics Project) cases.

**Evaluation:** Students will complete their patient encounter checklist as they progress through their clerkship. They will be required to document each type of patient encounter and their level of participation. Each student's progress will be reviewed during the third week of the clerkship. At that time, items that have not been completed will be assigned and students will submit documentation of completion of these items before they receive their final examination.

**2. Perform the essential and unique aspects of the pediatric physical examination.**

**Curriculum:** The pediatric examination will be modeled and taught by residents and faculty preceptors in both inpatient and outpatient settings. The necessary components of the examination are available to all students on the clerkship website.

**Benchmark:** The newborn examination and the young child (ages 2-10 years) examination will serve as the clerkship mini-CEX.

**Evaluation:** The student will demonstrate the two required examinations and be critiqued and evaluated on a standard form by residents or faculty.

**3. Compose at least three detailed patient "write-ups" including all necessary components described in curriculum materials.**

**Curriculum:** The necessary components and database of a written pediatric case presentation are available to all students on the clerkship website. An example write up is also provided in the orientation materials.

**Benchmark:** Over the course of the clerkship, the student will choose three of their patients to fully describe and discuss in standard written format.

**Evaluation:** The three "write-ups" will be critically edited by senior residents, faculty attendings or clerkship preceptors and reviewed with the student.

**4. Apply bioethical principles to analyze a pediatric bioethical issue.**

**Curriculum:** Clerkship preceptors will formally discuss pediatric bioethical issues with all clerkship students. Guidelines for pediatric ethics and professionalism are available to all students on the clerkship website.

**Benchmark:** Four specific pediatric bioethical cases will be available to all students. One is fully discussed, written to serve as a model and is available on the clerkship website. Students may apply the analysis approach taught in the ICM course or other methods of their choosing.

**Evaluation:** The student will discuss in writing one of the other three pediatric bioethical cases and submit it to the clerkship preceptor for evaluation by the midpoint (end of third week) of the clerkship.

**5. Research a topic in pediatrics and present an oral or written presentation on the material.**

**Curriculum:** The student will be directed to identify over the course of the clerkship a pediatric case or topic which can be thoroughly investigated. They will apply the principles of critical information analysis thought in the basic science curriculum to information about the topic.

**Benchmark:** The student will develop their topic as either a written report or an oral presentation.

**Evaluation:** The clerkship preceptor will evaluate this objective by either reviewing the written product or attending the oral presentation and providing student feedback on the accuracy of the content and clarity of the presentation.

**6. Demonstrate professional conduct with patients, staff, teachers and other health care professionals as outlined in the professional behavior benchmarks for the clinical years.**

**Curriculum:** Students will observe and model professional behavior as described in the professionalism benchmarks for the clinical years (available on the pediatric website). Students will informally discuss issues of professional behavior with faculty, staff and colleagues throughout the rotation.

**Benchmark:** The student will demonstrate professional behaviors as outlined in the UWSOM professionalism benchmarks for the clinical years.

**Evaluation:** Student professional behavior will be evaluated using the standard UWSOM evaluation form.

The Anchorage pediatric clerkship is a mentor model clerkship. Mornings are primarily an inpatient and didactic experience at the Children's Hospital at Providence. Afternoons are an ambulatory clinical experience in the mentor's offices. In addition, students will attend several subspecialty clinics, the Anchorage Neighborhood Health Center Pediatric Clinic, and follow patients in the NICU and PICU. In the hospital part of the rotation there is a close working relationship with the Providence Hospital Family Practice Residents. We generally have three third year students and commonly have fourth year students on pediatric subspecialty or family practice.

The site coordinator is Dr. Erin McArthur assisted by Dr. Jody Butto and Dr. Bruce Chandler. Housing, car and logistics of living on campus are coordinated by the Alaska WWAMI Biomedical program.

Pocatello, Idaho is one of the two oldest pediatric WWAMI sites. It is the only site that has continuously had both students and residents since its start in 1973. The Pocatello Children's Clinic is located in a newly built facility adjacent to Porteuf Medical Center.

Students in Pocatello work with all 8 of the faculty members at Pocatello Children's Clinic. Students will divide their time between the hospital and the physician offices. Faculty presents a series of lectures on pediatrics, and students will attend rounds, Journal Club and patient work-ups. Students are on call 2 nights per week, but call after midnight may be taken from home. Hospital care is done at Portneuf Medical Center, which is the site of the Family Medicine residency in Pocatello.

The rotation would include morning hospital experience with the family medicine residency pediatrics team. Each team covers newborn, NICU, pediatrics and PICU each day. Diagnoses cared for are incredibly variable, providing thorough exposure to pediatric diagnosis and specialized cases. Students are expected to on average 1 day a week take call with a resident, overnight sleeping rooms are available if needed. Afternoons will be spent in private general pediatricians' or pediatric subspecialist offices, gaining experience in the provision of outpatient care. There is an array of possibilities here, ranging from general practice to virtually every pediatric subspecialty.

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Great Falls is one of the original Pediatric WWAMI sites. The pediatric student site at the Great Falls Clinic serves north-central and northeastern Montana. Fifteen faculty in general and specialty pediatrics work with the students at this site. All students participate in developmental, pulmonology, neurology and ophthalmology clinics. Other specialty clinic experiences are available but these clinics are held only intermittently. The Clinic is adjacent to Benefis Healthcare, where students do all of their inpatient activities, which includes work in the newborn nursery, intensive care nursery, emergency room and on the pediatric floor. The ICN work is done with a neonatologist. The other inpatient experiences will be with one of the pediatricians or with our pediatric hospitalist. Students are on call one night per week and this is taken from home.

Community Medical Center is a 146 bed hospital, with 4 PICU beds and 8-12 pediatric ward beds. Admissions average approximately 6,000 each year, and with almost 100,000 outpatient physician visits annually. Two thirds of patient services are provided to residents of Missoula County; 20% are Ravalli and Lake County residents, and 15% from elsewhere, including from neighboring states.

The Pediatric Inpatient Service at CMC provides medical and surgical care for the children. The students will encounter a wide array of diseases and severity of disease from gastroenteritis to respiratory failure. Our medical staff has representatives of many pediatric subspecialties including: (locally) Anesthesiology, Cardiology, Neurosurgery, Plastic Surgery, Rehabilitation, Rheumatology, Surgery, and Urology; (regionally) Endocrinology, Genetics, Pulmonary, Neurology, and more. Medical students will be involved in the direct care of the pediatric patients with the supervision of the pediatric hospitalist, on the Pediatric Unit, and pediatricians, in the clinics. He/she is encouraged to assume responsibilities in independent evaluation, differential diagnosis, diagnostic studies, procedures, therapeutic decisions and discharge planning for each patient, while maintaining good communication with the supervising physician and primary care provider.

Madigan Army Medical Center (MAMC) is located south of Tacoma, Washington. It serves as the primary care site for Fort Lewis Army Base, and is the referral and specialty center for military personnel in the

Northwest and the Pacific Rim. Madigan has a pediatric residency program as well as residencies in family medicine, obstetrics, and general internal medicine and numerous other subspecialties including developmental pediatrics.

Twenty-five pediatric faculty provide both primary and specialty care. The clerkship is designed to provide a comprehensive yet varied approach to the pediatric patient. Conferences include daily morning report and CME lecture for the department, and noon lectures specifically tailored to medical students. Three weeks are in the outpatient setting, with one week dedicated to the approach to well child visits and two weeks primarily in the general pediatrics clinic but also with some exposure to specialty care including adolescent medicine. Two weeks will be on the inpatient ward and one week on the newborn nursery. Call at Madigan is one night per week during inpatient weeks, which includes pediatric consultations in the Emergency Room in the evenings.

Spokane is located in northeastern Washington and is the largest city in the Inland Northwest. The community has a population of over 400,000, and draws from a population of two million from the entire northeast part of Washington, the panhandle of Idaho and western Montana. The Spokane pediatric WWAMI site is a collaborative effort of over 30 pediatricians in greater Spokane. The clerkship is centered at Sacred Heart Medical Center but includes activities at Deaconess Medical Center and other local hospitals. The rotation is divided into a 4-week inpatient and outpatient experience, with additional weeks on the PICU and NICU service. On the inpatient service, pediatric students join the house staff team on the pediatric service at Sacred Heart Medical Center. Outpatient experience occurs in pediatricians' offices as well as specialty clinics and conferences. Little call is required. During nights on call, students may sleep in the House Staff quarters at Sacred Heart Medical Center. The Spokane pediatric clerkship is flexible in setting up additional clinical experiences for students with special interests.

**Activities:** Spokane has easily accessible skiing (downhill and cross country), mountain biking, fishing, climbing and hiking. It has an extensive paved bike trail system. A surprising variety of music and art venues are also found here.

As the only pediatric clinic in the area, more in-depth exposure to pediatric issues is available. Each physician has his/her own style and special interest including care of the newborn, adolescent medicine, child behavior and development, school problems, care of the hospitalized patient, and handicapping and chronic conditions in childhood. Pediatric Cardiac and Rehabilitation specialists conduct clinics at Cheyenne Children's Clinic four times a year each.

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
