Description:

Students based in Western Washington will be exposed to four content areas: Rehab Medicine, Geriatric Medicine, Palliative Care, and Pain Management. Students will choose to focus on one content area and will be assigned to a preceptor and a clinical site to concentrate their clinical activities in that content area. Students will have a didactic orientation at the beginning of the clerkship and will make their case presentation during a didactic session at the end of the clerkship. Palliative Care students are required to travel to various locations in the area to assist hospice nurses on home visits (the palliative care sites listed here are the home base sites).

Students in CONJ-691 (Idaho track) will be exposed to three content areas: Rehab Medicine, Geriatric Medicine, and Palliative Care. Students will have an orientation at the beginning of the clerkship and will make their case presentation during a didactic session at the end of the clerkship.

Students in CONJ-692 (Spokane track) will be exposed to two content areas: Rehab Medicine and Palliative Care. Students will have an orientation at the beginning of the clerkship and will make their case presentation during a didactic session at the end of the clerkship.

Goals:

The clerkship will expose students to broad issues in chronic illness and care. By this exposure, we hope that all students will be made aware of the following important issues:

- The student will be able to sensitively and effectively communicate prognosis for chronic or life threatening conditions to patients and families.
- The student will understand the importance of a multidisciplinary team approach and appreciate the roles of team members in providing care in chronic illness.
- The student will be able to identify and perform appropriate clinical and functional assessments of patients with chronic disease disability, and life limiting illness.
- The student will be able to identify how systems of care affect the delivery of care for patients with chronic disease, and life-limiting illness.
- The student will appreciate the role of adaptive, supportive, and palliative care when cure is not possible.
- The student will identify resources for patients and families that support appropriate management of medical conditions outside of the hospital and clinic setting.
- The student will be able to elicit and understand the patient and family's perspective on the management of medical issues, including individual preferences, cultural perspectives, and religious beliefs as they affect the delivery of care.

Objectives:

At the conclusion of this clerkship, students should be able to:

- Identify resources for and the best clinical practices of counseling patients around chronic for life threatening illnesses,
- Understand and appreciate the roles of team members in providing care in chronic illness and identify appropriate care providers to meet the multiple needs of patients with chronic illness,
- Develop a functionally oriented problem list and a set of patient centered goals for patients and families living with chronic or life limiting illness,
- Provide care aimed at the improvement of quality of life when cure of the patient's disease is impossible,

- Identify community resources available to assist patients and families for providing care in the patient's home or community,
- Appreciate the process of adaptation to chronic illness and reintegration of the patient into the family, community, and workplace,
- Identify issues related to the delivery of health services that either hinder or support care of patients, such as how health care financing determines the level and type of care available to patients in the home or community.

Evaluation:

Evaluation is based on three elements: observational ratings from preceptors, the comprehensive patient write-up, and student presentation of the comprehensive patient write-up.
